Mission accomplished

On August 20th, we set off on the Presidents' Tour with three important goals: to talk to our members about our contract negotiations and mobilization share activities. to members' concerns at the workplace, and to make it clear that UCCO-SACC-CSN is one strong union, from coast to coast. We are that strong union: 7,400 members working in 52 institutions spread across an immense territory.

In 5 weeks, we covered more than 14,000 kilometers and met faceto-face with more than 3,000 correctional officers. National President Pierre Mallette noted the concerns of each member he met, giving him a clear picture of the reality we face in all of our penitentiaries.

After the Presidents' Tour arrived in Calgary in the Prime Minister's riding, more than 500 correctional officers joined us from across the country to send a clear message to Prime Minister Stephen Harper: we are letting Canadians know that his funding cuts put our safety at risk in our institutions

and everyone's safety at risk in our communities. After rallying in front of Mr. Harper's riding office, officers went door-to-door and spoke to his constituents. Canadians have a right to know that "our security is yours too".

This fall, we will continue to build on this success, spreading our message across the country and fighting for a good contract. To each and every member who participated in the tour, to each and every local executive that helped make the tour a success:
